Why do we use Monster Phonics?

Fun, interactive and engaging lessons. Each monster has an action to go with their sound, making learning active

Recognition that all children learn differently

There are 144 different ways of spelling 44 sounds, for example: plate, rain, day, eight, great, table, they, vein

Monster phonics speeds up this process with memory queues plate, rain, day, eight, great, table, they, vein

In school:

40 minute phonics session 5x per week: children are taught to recognise sounds, decode and blend sounds to read words taken from the year group progression map.

decode: cat-cat read-read

- Flash cards colour coded and blank so that the colour coding remains a memory aid rather than children become dependent on colour coding
- Y2 phonics teaches children the last of the sounds they need to recognise and then moves onto spelling patterns and rules from the Spring term.
- Group reading with an adult 3x per week using Monster Phonics reading books
- 1:1 reading weekly

At home:

- Daily reading at home is recommended and we would love for you to document when you have read with your children in their reading record please!
- Changed every Friday (we may keep the book the same if it isn't clear that your child has read the book at home)
- Reading books are kept the same for 1 week to support confidence and build fluency
- Reading the monster phonics book more than once per week is recommended so that children start to recognise words and move on from decoding every word

Inside the reading books

- Each book has a phonic sound / group of sounds as a focus
- First two pages of every book are dedicated to word reading to prepare children for the words they will find in the story
- Comprehension questions at the back
- Large text is for the children to read, if your child gets stuck, allow them to take their time, then intervene by modelling how to decode the sounds and blend to read the word
- Small text is for the adult to read and is designed to build the story line to add enjoyment for children

Phonics Screening Check Year One only – June 2024

- The phonics screening check contains 40 words divided into two sections of 20 words. Both sections contain a mixture of real words and alien words. Alien words are words that are phonically decodable but are not actual words with an associated meaning. Alien words are included in the check to assess whether your child can decode a word using their phonics skills.
- All alien words in the check are accompanied by a picture of an alien. Children
 are taught that when a word has a creature next to it, it is a alien word. This is to
 ensure that they are not trying to match the alien word to a word in their
 vocabulary.
- The check is designed to give teachers information on how your child is
 progressing in phonics. It will help to identify whether your child needs additional
 support at this stage so that they do not fall behind in this vital early reading skill. If
 your child does not pass the check, they will re-take the check in Year 2.

practise reading words your child may come across in the phonics check. There is
no expectation to do this, as we will be ensuring your child is prepared in school,


Reading for Pleasure


Children will choose a library book of their choice each week to share at home

Angry Red A is brave. He lives in his cave.









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
Yellow I is a spy, and lives high in his red and white lighthouse.







Cool Blue is so cool, he lives in his blue moon house and is a DJ.




